Alabama Act 2024-194

Non-Certified mayors and councilmembers MUST complete 10 hours of training annually for a total of 40 hours during their first term in office beginning January 1, 2025.

Officials must complete a core curriculum of 20 hours comprised of 20 specific trainings from an approved list:
